Conservation News - Creighton Smith Dept. of Fish & Game

Reminder, there are three ways you can get your new 2010 fishing license. 1. At the local F&G office, 601 Locust Street, Redding CA,

- 2. On-line at www.dfg.ca.gov/OnlineSales
- 3. Or, at your local sports/fishing shop. (Note, Steelhead Report Cards must still be obtained at the F&G office or authorized agents.)

The local Fish & Game office will be closed on the first three Fridays of each month.

After March 1, 2010, you will no longer be required to display your license above the waist. Until then, you must continue to wear the license.

Additionally, beginning January 1, 2010, the Bay-Delta Sport Fishing Enhancement Stamp will no longer be required.

Steelhead Report Cards were due to be submitted by no later than January 31, 2010. You may submit your card at the local Fish & Game office or mail it to DFG Steelhead Fishing Report and Restoration Cards, P.O. Box 944209, Sacramento, CA 94244-2090. You can also go on-line and submit the information at: www.dfg.gov/Fishing/Monitoring/SHRC.

\$11 Million Water Bond on November Ballot

Last fall, the Governor and state policy makers passed a proposed \$11 million Water Bond that will appear on this November's ballot. The measure is designed to increase the reliability of water deliveries and at the same time restore the delta ecosystem for plants, animals, and fish.

Under the bond measure, a council will be formed to develop a "management plan" for the estuary. Further, new statewide conservation and ground water monitoring mandates are to be implemented, and penalties for failure to report water diversions increased. Management of California's water resources will continue to be a very complicated issue and decisions regarding wildlife habitat and water pumping will still require approvals by the various state and federal agencies. In addition, while the state Water Resources Control Board will have the authority to set freshwater flows into the delta, the agency will not be required to follow its own guidelines when reviewing permits to divert water.

I will continue to keep club members informed as this issue unfolds.

Judge Rejects Delay in Delta Pumping Restrictions

On February 10, 2010, U.S. District Judge Oliver W. Wanger rejected a request by west valley agricultural interests to delay a new set of water-pumping restrictions in the Sacramento-San Joaquin Delta. The ruling means one of five delta pumps operated by the

federal government will be shut down. The action is being taken to protect the delta smelt, a fish listed as threatened under the Endangered Species Act. Representatives from the Westlands Water District stated they will seek another emergency order from Wagner.

U.S. Sen. Feinstein Bill to Reduce Endangered Species Act Protections

Senator Feinstein has stated her intention to submit an amendment to a jobs bill that would remove restrictions in water diversions for Endangered Species and increase Delta pumping to benefit farms in the San Joaquin Valley. This proposal has generated strong reaction from concerned environmental groups and fellow For the past two years, the state, Democrats. agriculture, and environmental groups have been working towards the development of a conservation plan for the Delta. This coalition helped pass key water legislation last year and is studying plans for a canal, tunnel or other form of water conveyance for the Delta. The plan is designed to reduce conflicts over fisheries while producing reliable water supplies for other uses. Should Feinstein's amendment pass, it could derail this effort, leading to continued conflicts over water usage.

Klamath River Restoration/Hydropower Agreement

On February 18, 2010, after 7 years of difficult work, the Klamath River Settlement agreements were signed. The agreement represents the largest dam removal project ever undertaken. Though there remains ongoing debate concerning the timing and ability of the agreements to achieve their goals, this action is regarded as a significant victory for fisheries and local communities.

Future Conservation Projects

Word from the Fish and Game is that they intend to focus their resources this year on the various wild trout programs. While F&G staff's are still reviewing the various programs, they expect to need volunteers to conduct field and office work. Fish Camp Scholarships

The Shasta Trinity Fly Fishers and the Shasta Mayflies will again be offering Fish Camp Scholarships to interested youth ages 10 to 15. Each scholarship covers the entire cost of the 5-day, 4-night program put on by The Fly Shop of Redding, and includes accommodations, meals, and all use of the finest in fly fishing equipment. The camp teaches fly fishing, fly tying and other outdoor skills in a safe and friendly environment. Fish Camp is held on a private ranch outside of Weed at the base of Mt. Shasta.

To apply, each youth must fill out an application and write a short essay about why they want to go to Fish Camp and why they want to learn to fly fish.
