be a wade / float outing. Floaters can either float from the Rodeo Grounds or any other

section they desire.

Equipment: 5-7 wt. Rods, floating lines with indicators (or not) or sinking lines depending on your

preferred method.

Flies: Please check with the Fly Shop for a current list of what's working on the river. Typically

the list includes; Micro Mayflies; 14-18, Fox Poopah's: 14-16, Egg Patterns; 6-12, Copper

John's; 16-18, Prince Nymph's; 14-16, Golden Stones; 6-10 and Rubberlegs; 6-10

River access maps will be available at the meeting site for those wishing to fish other areas of the river.

**Note:** For those planning a float trip down the river. Attendees can use Drift Boats, Pontoon Boats, Kayaks or any other desired device. But remember this is big water and PFD's are recommended. If you plan on taking out at the Sacramento River RV Park there is a \$3 fee to use their takeout. Shuttles will be set up that morning to get floaters and conveyances back to the parking lot.

Coffee and Doughnuts will be served. Lunch is on your own.

#### SMITH RIVER STEELHEAD FISHOUT - MARCH 6, 7, 8 2012

The Smith River is the last main river in California without any dams. The giant race of steelhead found here are some of the biggest to be found anywhere south of Canada or maybe in a very few rivers in Washington and Idaho.

I was asked to put a trip together for Shasta Trinity Fly Fishers, during the late winter months. I picked March because that is when the weather maybe at its best, never a sure thing on the coastal rivers. Check your calendars or make a note of the event. This date will be finalized next year dependent on weather, water levels, etc.

Being as it may, we are going to give it a try and you have the chance of hooking that steelhead of a lifetime.

Gear & Flies: Single Handed Rods 8 to 10 weight with T-8 to T-14 sink tips, 12# leader tippet (big fish) Spey Rods min 7 wt best 8 or 9 with Skagit Heads and sink tips as above - Comet style flies, Boss flies, Intruder type, other heavy flies from #4 – 2/0

You may find some fish shallow, but most will be deep 6' - 15', slower water.

I will put on a short program/information session before we go.

Note: Other rivers, Eel, Chetco and several Coastal Oregon Streams close by.

# Delta Striper Fishout

In early November, eight anglers were lured to the California Delta to search for the often-elusive striped bass. On this venture warm and windless days, and even an occasional fish greeted us! Stripers were not available in great quantity, but with persistence and a lot of casting, catch rates were from 2 to a dozen or more per day per angler. Many of those were 2-4 lbs, and up to seven pounds. A bonus this year was salmon, and the group landed six for the week, up to 10 lbs. The evenings were filled with good food, good stories, and many laughs shared among Dave and Joe Allred, Don Wieseman, John Thorn, Dan Frost, Allan Craig, and for a day Jerry and Jake Allred.

The group also attended a Department of Fish and Game public hearing in Rio Vista regarding proposed changes to striper regulations. They have proposed, among other things, to increase the daily limit from two to six per day, with a cumulative possession limit of 52, and reduce the size limit from 18 to 12 inches. Since the vast majority of the attendees were adamantly opposed to this idea, I wondered how the DFG representative was chosen to present this proposal to the group?? Did he draw a short

straw, or have the largest life insurance policy?? Good topic for Conservation discussion.





## Trout in the Classroom - 2012

The Trout in the Classroom program could use a few more volunteers. We have the same schools and same enthusiastic teachers involved as last year, and we are sure that this year's students will be as excited and appreciative as those in the past.

Volunteers will need to attend an afternoon training session in January, and assist in egg delivery and caring for the fish tanks in February. It only requires about  $1\frac{1}{2}$  hours a week to test the water, vacuum the tanks and look out for water temp problems.

You will be working with the teacher and kids, and it's a blast to see the enthusiasm as the kids raise and then release the fish in March.

## **Trinity River Fishout Report**

On a mild fall morning on November 17<sup>th</sup>, close to twenty Fly Fishers and guests met at the Douglas City Fire Station for our annual Trinity River Fishout to chase fall-run steelhead. **Gerald Nelson** provided steaming hot coffee and the infamous pink boxes of donuts to get the day started.

**Ross Morrison** gave an overview of the plan to break into groups to search out different river accesses from the Douglas City Bridge down to Del Loma. Last year perhaps the greatest challenge of the day was finding un-crowded access with some willing steelhead. This year the river seemed less crowded, and most groups found some good-looking water and an occasional eager fish. Ross took his group to the North Fork area, while **Bary Caranci** worked the Douglas City Campground water. **Jim Murphy** the accesses along Steiner Flat Road, and **Bill Lenheim** and **Dick Russell** went downstream between Pigeon Point and Del Loma.

This year several "encounters" with steelhead were reported. The results were varied ranging from quick headshakes and pulls to fights of short duration to landing adult steelhead. The explanations of short connections ranged from broken tippets to "knot operator error" to "acts of God." Dick Russell took a nice 8 to 10-pound wild steelhead while swinging a black Intruder and got another grab with the same rig. Ross hooked a nice bright fish while demonstrating nymphing with an indicator to **Fidel** and **Shirley Camarillo** and Gerald. The lesson seemed to be effective as later Fidel landed a nice fish and Gerald hooked one briefly. **Wes Forman** caught a nice brown trout on his first cast.

We ended the day at the One Maple Vineyards where our host Ernie poured some nice chardonnays and cabernets. It was a fitting ending to a fine day on the Trinity River with all attendees reporting an abundance of sharing and camaraderie.
