Todd Cooper caught the most fish and lost the most fish, but I have to say that to watch him was the best show of the day. I don't think I have ever seen anyone get so excited about catching a fish in my life. Jess Hoopes caught the fish of the day, which I've heard guesses of 10 lbs to 12 lbs, depending on who you talk to. Project Healing Waters Eagle Canyon Fishout - 2/13/2013

Eleven Project Healing Waters participants, accompanied by five STFF volunteers, took advantage of a gorgeous, sunny, 73 degree late winter day on February 13, to fish the private ponds at Eagle Canyon. Access to the ponds was generously donated by Andrew and Katie Harris of Confluence Outfitters. All of the participants had multiple hookups, although with the big fish, the hookups out-numbered fish landed. Most fish brought to net averaged 5-6 lbs. The big fish of the day was approximately 10-12 lbs and was caught on a black wooly bugger. The fly of the day seemed to be rubber legs but fish were caught on everything from San Juan Worms, PT's, Zebra Midges and yes, a Crazy Charlie bone fish fly.

Most of the PHW participants didn't have any fly fishing experience prior to participating in PHWFF. Fishing with a fly rod is not only a new experience, but catching fish of this size was certainly memorable. We heard positive comments throughout the day and after the fishout, as well. There was a lot of whooping and hollering throughout the day as fish were brought to net. We should have some terrific hero shots of the fish of a lifetime soon. The event was covered by CBS TV station KHSL, Chico and was shown on the news that night. We were delighted to see the participants get closer as a group and to have them experience the joy and excitement that fly fishing brings to all who enjoy the sport. It is definitely helping the healing and recovery process. The PHWFF program is only a small way STFF members can give back and thank those who have given so much for this country.

The next fishout for PHW participants is scheduled for March 13 and 14 and will be Trinity River drift boat trips, donated by guides from the Trinity River Guides Association. We have 8 participants making the trip that includes an overnight stay at Indian Creek Lodge. He will be tying two of his best choices for fishing underwater, whether it would be lakes, rivers or ponds. These flies are the kind that will always produce fish. The Eagle Bugger is best for fishing Eagle Lake and everywhere else. The Sheep Creek Special is a great searching fly that has been around for many years.

Scholarships to The Fly Shop 2013 Kids' Fish Camp

Fantastic Opportunity for Six Kids to Learn to Fly Fish

Local fly fishers from the Shasta Trinity Fly Fishers and Shasta Mayflies will again be sponsoring six youth, ages 10 through 15, to attend a week long fly fishing camp this summer. It is the mission of the club to spread fly fishing knowledge and enjoyment to the next generation, as well as help them learn to appreciate our local streams, rivers, and lakes. For the past fourteen years, The Fly Shop of Redding has run a kid's Fish Camp, currently being held at its private preserve, Antelope Creek Ranch, near Weed. The experienced pros at this camp teach youth various casting techniques, how to select and tie on artificial flies, how to read the waters, and how to land and safely release the fish they catch. Other fun parts of the camp experience include great meals, nightly campfires, fly tying classes, and group games.

These scholarships will be for camp sessions held in June or July of 2013. Each session is limited to 20 campers. The full \$750 cost of the five-day / four-night program, including accommodations, meals, and equipment, will be covered for six youth, ages 10 through 15, by the Shasta Trinity Fly Fishers and Shasta Mayflies scholarships. *The Kids' Fish Camp application form is found on page 13.*

Although youth from all over the United States attend these summer sessions of Fish Camp, only those from Shasta, Siskiyou, Tehama, and Trinity counties are eligible to participate in this contest to win one of the six scholarships. Spring Fly Casting Classes for Beginners

The Beginners Fly Casting Classes will begin on April 23, 2013. These classes run on five consecutive Tuesdays for two hours each class. Classes begin at 6 PM and run until about 8 PM each evening. They will be held on the lawn just south of the Redding Convention Center across from Channel 7 in the Turtle Bay Area.

The classes will cost \$35 per person (check or cash) for the whole series of five classes. Bring eye protection and a rod with a matching reel and line. Add a <u>9 foot leader with 3X or 4X tip diameter</u>, we will supply the fluff, no hooks are allowed. We do not use indicators, so please set up the outfit with a tapered leader. If you don't know what that means, ask someone at The Fly Shop. Reservations are not needed, so just show up. Please arrive 5 to 10 minutes early for each class to allow time to set up your gear. All classes will begin promptly at 6 PM. In case of rain, determination of cancelling the class will be made depending on conditions at the venue location, regardless of conditions elsewhere. If a session is rained out, the classes will be extended a week to insure the full series is presented. There is no fee required for students aged 16 or under.

Important: Since the instruction uses a step by step approach, with each step building on the next, please show up to each class. If you miss a class we will not be able to take time away from the other students to catch you up on what was missed during the previous class. This is of particular importance for the first three classes. Students will find it difficult to proceed successfully, if they miss a class.

When and where: Tuesdays: April 23, 30, May 7, 14 and 21. Time: 6 PM - 8 PM

Location: On the lawn just south of Redding Convention Center in the Turtle Bay area across from the Channel 7 studio in the Turtle Bay Area.

What to bring: Rod, Reel, Line, Leader (9 foot, 4x or 3x), hat and protective glasses. No strike indicators or hooks are allowed. Yarn flies will be provided.

Important: If you don't have glasses you will not be allowed to cast.

Double-Handed Casting Instruction (Spey Casting)

Guy Manning will be presenting a four session Double-Handed Casting Clinic this Summer. Also known as Spey Casting, Double-Handed casting is an extremely effective way to cover a large amount of water and get the fly to the fish. The cost is \$50 for all four classes, payable in cash or check at the first class. The class will be limited to six students on a first come, first served basis.

This class will cover the following:

- A short history of Double-Handed Casting
- The differences between Spey, Skagit, and Scandi rods and lines
- Fishing methods used with each technology
- Double Handed Casting Terminology
- Discussion of river right and river left and the casts used in each situation
- Basic body and rod positions
- Motions of a simple DH cast
- Switch cast
- Snap-C cast
- Double Spey cast
- Single Spey cast
- Snake Roll cast

Classes will be held on Saturday mornings from 9:30 AM until 12:00 noon, on June 22, 29, July 13 and 20, 2013. The first two classes will be held on the lawn south of the convention center in the Turtle Bay complex, across from the Channel 7 Studios. The last class will be on the water at a location to be decided, probably the barge hole. Please show up about 10 minutes early for each session so you have time to set up your gear prior to the start of class.

What to bring: Rod, Reel, Line, leader, hat and protective glasses. No hooks are allowed. A yarn fly will be provided. You will need to make a grass leader for the second and third session. Instructions on making grass leaders will be given during the first class. For the last two classes you will want wading gear.
