Hat Creek Wild Fish Section Fishout

Monday June 10, 2013

Fishmaster: Bary Caranci, caranci@aol.com, 242-6554

We'll meet at the Shasta County Day Use Park on 299E at the Hat Creek Bridge at 9:30 AM. Those wanting to car pool could meet at My T Fine Foods at the corner of 299E and Deschutes at 8:00 AM. Drive time from Redding is around one hour and fifteen minutes. Commuters should be on the road by 8:15 AM.

We'll try to catch the late morning hatch and the afternoon Salmon fly drop, if there are still some around by June. After a meet and greet we'll divide forces to subdue the trout in the PH2 riffle area, Carbon Flats, or the fish barrier section. Each area offers different fishing opportunities and techniques.

Equipment:

- Rods in 4, 5, or 6 wts with floating lines
- Leaders in 4X (7 $\frac{1}{2}$ 9 ft) for nymphing and 5X 6X (9 12 ft) for dries plus tippet
- Flies: Midge, caddis, mayfly, and stonefly nymphs and attractors, PMD, caddis, small yellow stoneflies, possibly Salmon flies. Check The Fly Shop stream report.
- Waders, boots, hats, polarized glasses, sunscreen, water, lunch and badge.

Hat Creek Wild Trout Section Access Points:

- **Shasta County Day Use Park**: Turn left just before the Hat Creek bridge into the park. Toilet and picnic facilities, but no water. Fish to rising fish from bridge to a short distance below the park. Bank fishing as silt bottom precludes wading. Hiking access to lower meadow and fish barrier across bridge from park.
- **Power House 2 Riffle**: Turn right on PH 2 Road (2.6 mi from 4 corners) and follow paved road approximately 2 miles down to the power house. Toilet facilities but no water, adequate parking. High stick indicator nymphing through riffle and dry fly opportunities with multiple hatches. Site fishing and limited wading for rising fish in flat water below riffle.
- Lower meadow to fish barrier: Turn left on dirt road (.8 miles from PH2 road) and follow dirt road to dead end. Hike along old roadbed to river. Fish broken runs down through treed meadow to the barrier. Nymphs, dries, dry with droppers. Note: take bearings to return to parking area.
- Carbon Flat: Turn right off highway after the Hat Creek bridge and immediately before the Pit River bride. Enter and close green access gate. Follow dirt road across rangeland and course right down the hill to the parking area. No facilities or water available. Hike along bank with stealth and fish to rising fish. Technical fishing with long leaders, fine tippet and good line control. Large educated fish are rewarding to fool.

The Mayflies met in May for lunch at Angelo's Pizza and had a good turn-out, including some new members! Discussions centered around Mayfly sponsored activities and fishouts. We also got some great fishing reports from some of the attendees, including Dee Cleary who was treated to a guided fishing trip in Trinity County for her anniversary.

Linda Slater organized an outing with Sue Young for Lake Christine on May 18th. The outing was a fund-raiser for the youth fly fishing camp scholarships. Nine women participated in a fun day on the lake and caught some large trout. Linda will also be coordinating the Mayfly sponsored fishing fund-raiser at Rock Creek Lake from August 14-18th. It will be open to women only for the first couple of days, and then open to all STFF members after that. Call Linda if you are interested in participating at 246-0541.

Last year the Rock Creek Lake event was cancelled when the Manton fire occurred. The Fly Shop plans to have a new cabin constructed in time for this year's fish-out. Many of us are looking forward to getting back there to fish the lake this summer! Your reservation will not be secured until Linda has received your payment, so don't delay! Project Healing Waters Update

Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing has had a very busy last few months. In March we had an overnight outing to Indian Creek Lodge on the Trinity River. Our stay was fantastic, thanks to John and Elena and their staff. They made us feel so welcome and comfortable. We had 10 participants and 8 volunteers from Shasta Trinity Fly Fishers staying at the lodge. On the first day we fished the Trinity River from the lawn directly behind the lodge and had several Steelhead hookups. That evening members from Trinity County Guide Association joined us for a very nice dinner provided by Cattlemen's Restaurant. I think everyone enjoyed their meal as we had no leftovers. The next day we enjoyed a float on the Trinity, provided by the Trinity County Guide Association. There were at least ten boats from our group and I think we took up every portion of the river that was available to fish during the day. We couldn't have asked for a better fishout with most all of the boats having hook ups with Steelhead and Browns. Personally I landed two Steelhead and lost one that broke my rod. All in all, it was a great trip.

April was another very busy month. Along with our regular class sessions, we had two fishouts. The first was a trip to Bidwell Ranch, courtesy of Wilderness Unlimited. Due to the size of our group we broke our fishout into two days. One group fished on a Tuesday and the other group the following Thursday. The weather on the first day didn't cooperate, however, as Tuesday greeted us fly fishers with snow and a strong wind. Being the diehard fishermen that we are, though, we hung in there with several hook ups and one nice fish landed by yours truly. The Thursday group fared much better weather wise with sunny skies, warm temps and little wind but the fishing was much tougher. I didn't hear of any fish being landed that day although there were reports of numerous hook ups.

The second April event was a fishout as Cassel, shortly after the opening day of trout season. We fished the Cassel fore bay and canal, normally very productive water for the put and take fishers. As is normally the case, the fore bay and canal was heavily fished on Saturday, opening day, so fishing was a little slow when our group fished the waters on Tuesday. Several nice fish in the 2 to 3 lb range were landed, however, and all in all, everyone had a good time.

The third special event in April was sending Jessica Oliff to the Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing Annual Two Fly Tournament in Virginia. Jessica and her teammate, Josh, pulled a third place win in the event. Jessica tells me that she had personal casting lessons from Lefty Kreh and that she learned so much from her experience.

May has started out to be a busy month for us as well. Along with our regular class sessions, we have a couple of planned fishouts. Our first fishout was at Allen Cordy's bass pond. Allen generously invited us to fish his private pond for bass and large pan fish. In addition, he cooked us lunch, provided soft drinks and snacks and gave us all a truly relaxing and enjoyable day. I could have spent the day just sitting under the trees. The fishing was very good. I think that everyone caught fish. I have to say this event was the most relaxing event that I have attended. Our next trip in May will be to Lewiston Lake for a day of fishing on the lake provided by the residents at Lewiston Lake. More on this event later.

Double-Handed Casting Instruction (Spey Casting)

Guy Manning will be presenting a four session Double-Handed Casting Clinic this Summer. Also known as Spey Casting, Double-Handed casting is an extremely effective way to cover a large amount of water and get the fly to the fish. The cost is \$50 for all four classes, payable in cash or check at the first class. The class will be limited to six students on a first come, first served basis.

This class will cover the following:

- A short history of Double-Handed Casting


