#### **April 1 Fishout (Fly only Water)**

The fly water stretch of the Trinity opens Tuesday, April 1, 2014. This is the best opportunity we get for catching a steelhead using dry flies. This is a popular event so you want to arrive early (7:00 AM) to get the best spot. I will be on the west side of the river opposite the hatchery. Bring a 6wt. rod/reel with dry fly line. You will also want to have a "fresh" 9' to 12' 3x leader and tippet. Dry Flies to bring include March Browns, Caddis, Pale Mourning Duns and Blue Wing Olives (tied parachute style) in sizes #16 and #14. Those nymphing should have Copper Johns, Yellow Stones, Hairs Ear or Bird's Nests in sizes #14 and #12. You can also fish for salmon and steelhead smolts (5" to 7") with a light rod but be very careful in handling and releasing the fish. Reminder, you need to have a 2014 License and Steelhead Card. I will not have access to email or phone until after March 30, so if you have guestions, send or leave a message (cr8smith@gmail.com or 243-4388) and I'll get back with you on March 31. -- Creighton Smith, Fishout Coordinator

## **PHWFF Eagle Canyon Fishout 2014 Report**

Redding's PHWFF Program initiated the 2014 fishout year with a very successful outing to Eagle Canyon. Thanks to Confluence Outfitters and to Andrew and Katie Harris who allowed PWHFF to fish their private ponds again this year. The participants had good weather and had a great time catching big trout on flies that took bunny leeches stripped on intermediate lines and red and black size 16 to 20 midges under indicators. Reports are that our PHWFF participants accounted for the most fish caught in a day for any group this year.

All of the participants caught fish with many having numerous hookups, some loosing fish due to that adrenaline rush and subsequent "what do I do now" excitement caused by hooking a big fish on a fly rod for the first time. "The guys are getting good" were comments by our volunteers who compared this year's fishout to our last year's fishout to Eagle Canyon, when the program was just starting and all of the participants were new to the sport.

Biggest fish caught was an 18 pounder, definitely a "big boy". We did measure the length and girth to get the weight. All fish caught were in the 4 pound and above category, a real treat for any fly fisher. One participant did catch fish in double digit numbers. You can see more on the Eagle Canyon Trophy Trout Lakes web site, February 19 date. We're already looking forward to 2015. The real test is our next fishout in March. We will be drifting fishing for steelhead on the Trinity.






STFF Clover Creek Clubhouse SITE

### **BEGINNER'S CASTING LESSONS**

Beginner's casting classes will be held on five consecutive Tuesday evenings, May 5 through June 3, 2014. Classes run from 6:00 PM until 8:00 PM. There is a \$35 fee payable at the first class.

Please show up early so you have time to assemble your gear. Be sure to wear a hat and protective glasses (sunglasses ok). Classes begin promptly at 6:00 PM. Classes will be held on the south lawn across from the Redding Convention Center in the Turtle Bay complex.

<u>Required Equipment:</u> Bring a fly rod with matching <u>floating</u> line on a reel. Purchase a 9 or 10 foot, 3X tapered leader (available at any fly shop). The leader must be tapered. No strike indicators on level tippet material.

The lessons will include overhead casting, how to make well-formed loops, roll casting, shooting line and shortening line, how to adjust your cast for the amount of line extended and simple mending.

Because the classes follow a step by step progression, missing any but the last class will put you at least two lessons behind the others. The instructor cannot take time out away from the other students to catch you up, as there is insufficient time to do so, and you will likely not be up to the skill level to proceed on the following lessons. So it is strongly suggested that you attend all classes. If you cannot make it to all of the classes, it is suggested you not attend.

At the conclusion of the five weeks, if there is sufficient interest and commitment, there will be free follow-up casting sessions, open to all, through the summer on alternate Tuesday evenings. No need to sign up. Just show up.
